ATTENTION 2012 CANDIDATES FOR UNDERGRADUATE DEGREES!

All May and July 2012 candidates for undergraduate degrees must sign a written application for degree and participate in a degree conference with Sheila Freeman, Registrar. Failure to participate in a degree conference will nullify candidate for degree status. If you expect to graduate in May or July of 2012 and have not already signed your application for degree, please come to the Office of the Registrar or call the Office of the Registrar to set up a conference time prior to February 1.

Tuesday, January 24, was the last day that a student could drop/add a course for the spring semester through his/her faculty advisor. All drops/adds made beginning Wednesday, January 25, must be processed through the Office of the Registrar. Any student who wishes to drop/add a course will need to come to the Office of the Registrar to pick up a drop/add slip to be signed by the advisor/instructor and returned for processing. Students who drop courses beginning January 25 will still be charged for the courses and a "W" grade will be posted on their transcript. Writing Proficiency Exam Workshops

Part I will focus on understanding prompts and coming up with thesis statements. Part II will focus on wise time usage, scratch outlines, and quick revision strategies.
